Course announcement:

The course is mainly addressed to PhD students, young researchers/lecturers, academic and administrative staff in general interested in internationalization of higher education, external funding opportunities and project management.

The participants will be provided with a general overview on the available opportunities for funding their international cooperation activities and with the necessary tools to successfully apply for the relevant actions. Each participant should after the course be able to autonomously identify the relevant action matching their needs, describe in a clear and professional way the project methodology, activities, expected results, and to submit the application. They will also be provided with the basic elements for eventually running selected project on the basis of existing best practices. They will also have the knowledge for setting their own local activities in the larger framework of the European Higher Education Area so to maximize efficiency, visibility and impact on a larger scale and through this boost their academic career.

Each module focuses on a homogeneous set of topics and is relatively independent from the other modules so to allow participants to select the modules relevant to their needs.

Participation to the first module is recommended to all the participants.

No previous direct experience in European funding mechanisms or project management is required.
