The Beginnings

- In 1887 the Minister of education issued an ordinance establishing a teacher-training course at the Boys' Secondary school in Sofia
- Classes began on 1st October 1888

The University in the 1888/1889 academic year

- 4 full-time lecturers
- 3 part-time lecturers
- 43 students
- 1 faculty Faculty of History and Philosophy
- The first Rector Alexander Teodorov-Balan
- A graduate of the universities in Prague and Leipzig,
 Doctor of the university of Prague, a Professor of linguistics, dialectology and Slavic philology

- ➤ In 1904 a law was passed to transform the Higher School into a "Bulgarian University"
- The brothers Evlogi and Hristo Georgievi from Karlovo had donated the land and the money for the construction of the university
- The new building was ready in 1934



- > The largest academic and research centre in Bulgaria
- > 16 Faculties
- 3 Departments
- > around 100 BA programs

THE DEPARTMENTS

- ➤ Department of Language Teaching and International Students: a successor to the Institute for Foreign Students (IFS) founded in 1963 continuing the latter's long tradition in Bulgarian language teaching of foreign learners after its incorporation into Sofia University in 1999
- ➤ Department for Information and In-service Training of Teacher: founded in 1953 as an In-Service Teacher Training Institute, integrated into Sofia University in 1983 with a main purpose to support the professional development, qualification and career advancement of educators
- > Department of Sports

FACULTY OF CLASSICAL AND MODERN PHILOLOGY

- The Departments and Degree Programs originated within the Faculty of History and Philology in the 1920s
- >A separate Faculty of Philology was established in 1951
- ➤In 1965 it was separated into a Faculty of Slavic Studies and a Faculty of Western Languages. The latter was renamed Faculty of Classical and Modern Philology in 1979
- The Centre for Eastern Languages and Cultures (CELC) was established in 1983 as a Department at the Faculty
- Now it consists of four separate Departments of Arabic Studies, Turkic Studies, East Asian Studies, and Classical East offering eight Bachelor's degree programs

- > First group of students admitted in 2008

- > Taught in English only
- ➤ More than 100 students have already graduated
- > Three languages
- > Two Modules in the third and fourth year
- One semester abroad

- Founded on the rich expertise of the University in teaching in various fields of the humanities at B.A. and M.A. levels.
- For more than 25 years the International Relations (IR) Program based at the Law Faculty has proven to be a success-story of intra- and inter-departmental University education.
- The same is valid for the European Studies Program based on tested West-European practices, which has run successfully for 20 years as an inter-departmental program at the Faculty of Philosophy.
- Five other faculties of the University the Faculty of Classical and Modern Philology, the Faculty of Economics, the Faculty of Mass Communications and Journalism, the Faculty of Geology and Geography and the Faculty of History, have had an outstanding record of teaching specific European-focused subjects
