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EURASIA Online courses

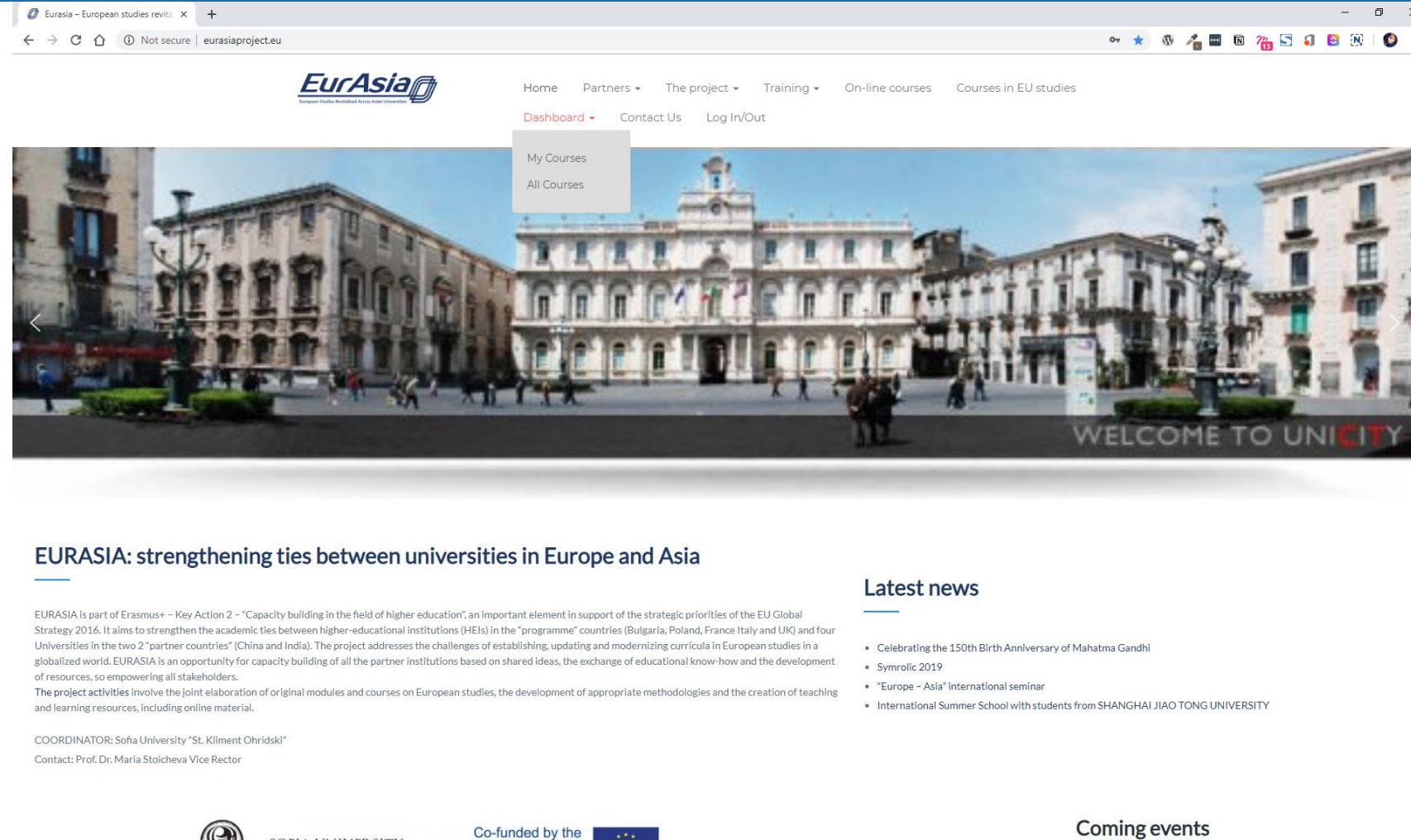
- The EURASIA online learning environment allows teachers and students from all partner universities to access online distance learning courses.
- Each course is equivalent to 1,5 credits and consists of 5 units.
- The courses include built-in assessment tools – open-ended assignments and different types of quizzes and tests. Successful completion of all courses within any of the five thematic areas will result in obtaining a certificate.

Apply for and get access to an online course

- Students can apply for a course as individuals or as part of a group.
- After obtaining a username and password, students gain access to the course or courses they have applied for through the Student Dashboard.

Course Description

Aims

The course aims to explain what we mean by Multilingualism, since it is a term which is used both to describe a place where many languages are spoken as well as a person who speaks a number of languages. It will give examples of a number of multilingual policies and show how these reflect broader values in society, in Europe and also more widely. It will also describe the various types of language policy which have been developed in response to an increasingly multilingual world and summarise what their effects have been.

We will also consider the value of people speaking a range of languages, and also the challenges that this poses not least for education system, looking at examples in a number of countries

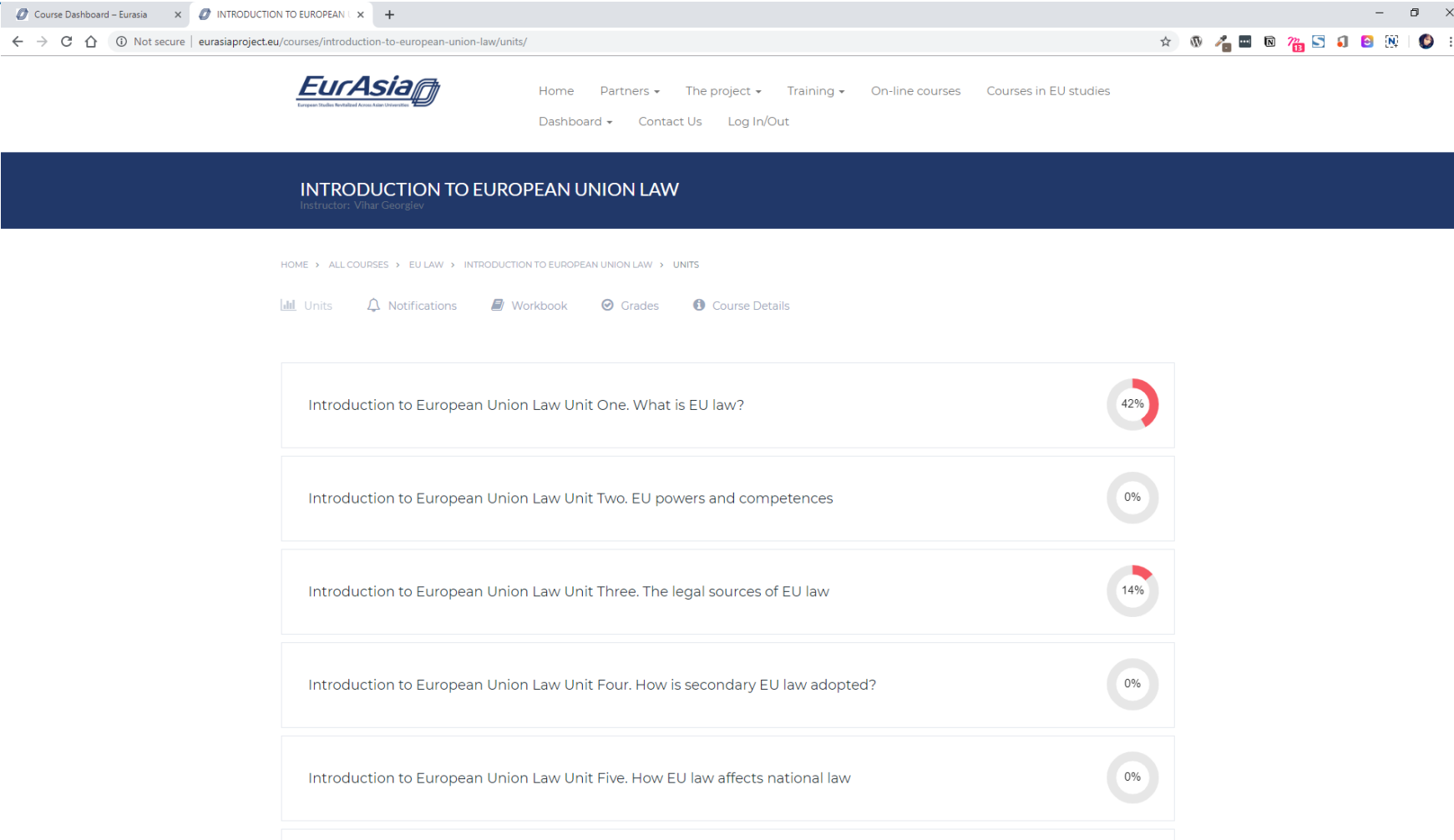

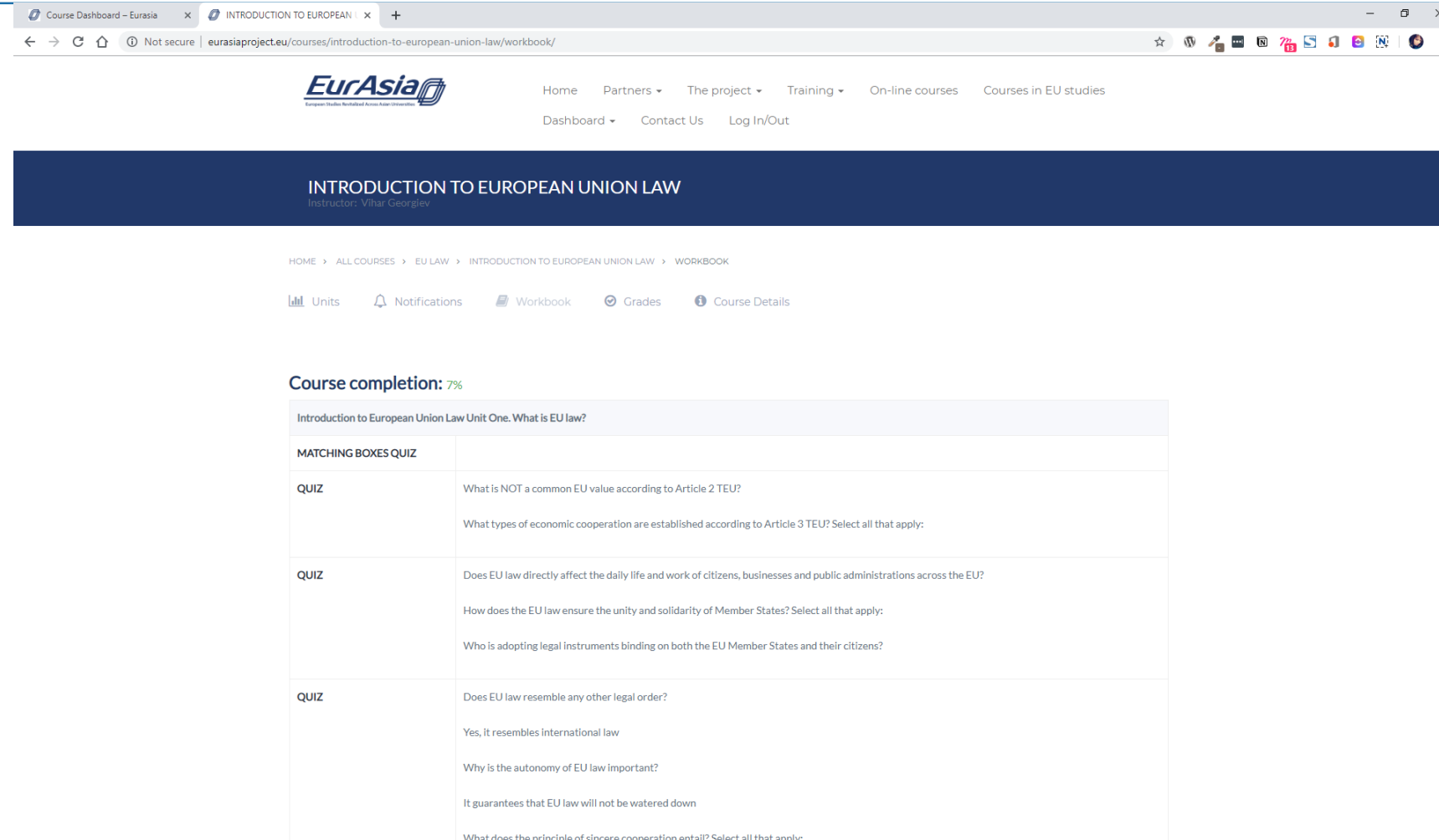

FAQ

Q: If a student can't finish the whole unit, what happens with his progress?
