Guangdong University of Foreign Studies

Guangdong University of Foreign Studies, abbreviated as GDUFS, is located in Guangzhou, which is known as the “Flower City”. GDUFS is selected as the “2011 Plan” and the “Asian University Student Exchange Collective Action Plan” (Asian Campus Project). It is one of the 19 universities in the world that provide high-end translation talents to the United Nations, one of the founding units of the national international economics and trade discipline, and a member of the International University Translation College Federation.

Guangdong University of Foreign Studies is a key university in Guangdong Province with distinctive international characteristics. It is an important base for the training of international talents, foreign language culture, foreign economic trades and trade, and international strategic research in South China. At present, there are 19,826 full-time undergraduates, 4031 postgraduates for doctoral and master's degrees, and more than 23,000 adult undergraduates, advanced training and trainees, and foreign students.

The University upholds the motto of Pursuit of Integrity, Practice and Cross-cultural Learning and defines as its mission the education of high-caliber citizens through the integration of content studies and foreign language training for globally minded graduates with international vision and social responsibility. The University serves over 20,000 full-time undergraduate students, nearly 3,000 graduate students and over 12,000 international and continuing-education students. It is one of the 19 universities worldwide qualified to provide high-end translation professionals to the United Nations and the only foreign studies-oriented university in the CAMPUS Asia program. With its undergraduate students admitted in the first-round or early admission category through college examination system, the graduation index of this University's graduates ranked top among the universities across China.

Sofia University St. Kliment Ohridski

Sofia University St. Kliment Ohridski is the first Bulgarian high academic school establishment. Its history is an embodiment and a continuation of a century-long cultural and educational tradition of the Bulgarian nation.

In 1880, the Bulgarian Ministry of Education tabled a draft, aiming to establish the first Bulgarian higher education institution covering disciplines of law, philosophy, medicine, natural sciences and engineering, etc. Sofia University St. Kliment Ohridski is the first Bulgarian high academic school establishment. Its history is an embodiment and a continuation of the centurylong cultural and educational tradition of the Bulgarian nation.

In 1880 the Bulgarian Ministry of Education tabled a draft of the Main Educational Act for the Schools in the Principality of Bulgaria in the National Assembly. It envisaged that “after completing the requirements of the Real and Classical schools to open a Bulgarian high school (a University) that will teach the sciences of law, the arts, the sciences, the medical sciences, and the technological sciences.” In 1887, T. Ivanchev, minister of education, issued an Ordinance for the Opening of a Pedagogy Class Affiliated to the First Male Gymnasium in Sofia. The classes began on 1st. Oct., 1888. On 8th, Dec., 1888 the National Assembly passed an act transforming the latter into a High School; the act was promulgated on 1st, Jan., 1889 with Decree No. 159 published in the Government Gazette. Alexander Teodorov-Balan was elected its first Rector. In the provisional Statute adopted the establishment of a history-philological department was the only one envisaged. During the 1889-1890 academic year, the physics-mathematical department was opened, and in 1892 the Faculty of Law was inaugurated.

Guangdong Institute for International Strategies (GIIS)

With the approval of the People's Government of Guangdong Province, Guangdong Institute for International Strategies (GIIS) was established in November, 2009. GIIS is a research consultancy institute with Guangdong University of Foreign Studies (GDUFS) as its functional base, and has 40 full time research fellows. The President of GIIS is the Vice Governor of Guangdong Province, and the Executive Vice President is Prof. Sui Guangjun, Chairman of the University Board, GDUFS. The presidencies of GIIS consist of the Policy Research Office of the CPC Guangdong Committee, Development Research Center of Guangdong, Department of Education of Guangdong Province, Department of Commerce of Guangdong Province, Foreign Affairs Office of Guangdong Province, and so on. GIIS has 4 PhD and Master's Programs, and a Post-Doctoral Work Station of the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security, and a Post-Doctoral Work Station jointly established by GDUFS and GRAM Group. Focusing on the key international issues of "China participating in global economic governance", "21st-Century Maritime Silk Road", "Regional Diplomacy" and "Global Value Chain", GIIS is now one of the key units for cooperation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and one of the presidencies of the "Belt and Road" Think Tank Association, and the Guangdong Base of China-ASEAN Think Tank Network, and the Key Base for Soft Sciences of Guangdong. In 2019, the Collaborative Innovation Center for 21st-Century Maritime Silk Road Studies was approved to be a center jointly supported by the Ministry of Education and Guangdong Province. GIIS is listed as top 100 among all Asian countries in the TTSCP Think Tank Report by the University of Pennsylvania (only 12 Think Tanks From China are selected) GIIS ranked the 3rd among BRI Local Think Tank of the State Council Information Center. GIIS ranked the 4th in the CTTI Regional Think Tank and Intentional Relation Studies.

JIAO Fangtai, PhD. in Management; Professor of Economics. He is a member of the Standing Committee of CPC GDUFS Committee, Vice President of Guangdong University of Foreign Studies. He received Bachelor's degree in Philosophy from Xiamen University and his PhD. in Management from Wuhan University. He ever served as Director of the International Division, Director of the Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan Office, Director of the Academic Affairs Division and Director of the Admission Office of Guangdong University of Foreign Studies. He has served as the Secretary-General of Guangdong Multinational Corporations Research Centre, director of Guangdong WTO Advisory Service Centre, and Chairman of the Working Committee of Foreign Cultural and Educational Experts of Guangdong Association of Higher Education. He is mainly engaged in teaching and research in international trade theories and policies, and international business of Chinese enterprises.



STOICHEVA, Maria, *Jean Monnet Chair*. Maria Stoicheva is Professor at the Department of European Studies and Functional Rector of Sofia University “St Kliment Ohridski”, Bulgaria. She received her Ph.D. at the same University. She is Jean Monnet Chair of European Identity and Multilingualism and has served as expert to the European Commission and the Council of Europe. She works on European identity, philosophy of language, and language policies. She has published 4 books, book chapters and is currently the Coordinator of the Jean Monnet Network on European identity, culture, exchanges and multilingualism.



LI Qing, Ph.D., is the co-founder and Chief Secretary of Guangdong Institute for International Strategies (GIIS) and Fulbright Scholar of the Think Tanks and Civil Societies Program (TTCSP), Lauder Institute, Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania. Dr. LI's research focuses on the Chinese enterprises' overseas investments as well as their international strategic planning development. She led more than 20 research projects in this area at the national and provincial level and served as a key member for more than 50 projects as well. She is now hosting the General Program of National Natural Science Foundation of China which studies the Building of "Belt and Road" and Made-in-China Products: Strategic Transformation and Upgrading of Value Chain. She also studies on the industrial linkage of China and countries along the "Belt and Road" for industrial upgrading under the background of building the "Belt and Road", and provides advice to governments and enterprises on how to make successful overseas investment.



WANG Xiaohai, Professor; PhD; Erasmus + "Jean Monnet Chair", European Commission; Visiting Scholar at Harvard University (2012-2013). He focuses on culture studies, cultural anthropology, culture and EU/European integration, intercultural communication, "Belt and Road" cultural dimensions, and cultural diplomacy, etc. In recent years, he has published several monographs and translations, over ten papers in international and domestic journals, and hosted several research projects, including two EU Erasmus+ "Jean Monnet" research projects. He is currently working on the Jean Monnet Research Project. He is currently working on the "Jean Monnet Chair" project "Culture and Sustainability in the European

He also served as Deputy Secretary-General of China Association for International Education, Chairman of Guangdong Association of Higher Education–Foreign Students Working Committee and, and Class Director of the Senior Civil Servants/Youth Leaders Training Course for Pacific Island Countries (2015-2018).



Nikolina Tsvetkova is an Associate Professor at the European Studies Department, Sofia University St. Kliment Ohridski, Bulgaria, where she teaches ESP, Intercultural communication, and Project terminology. She has also been involved in teacher training and material design. Her research interests are in the field of language education, intercultural education, introducing EU topics at secondary schools, and applying ICTs in teaching and learning. She has published articles, book chapters and a monograph in these areas. Dr. Tsvetkova has also co-authored textbooks for learning English for the Bulgarian primary and secondary school system. She is also on the editorial board of the Foreign Language Teaching journal issued by the Bulgarian Ministry of Education (<https://foreignlanguages.azbuki.bg/>) and acts as an associate editor for the International Journal of Virtual and Personal Learning Environments issued by IGI Global.



Teodora Peneva is a chief assistant professor at the Economic Research Institute at the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. Dr. Peneva graduated her master degree in the Department of Economics at the Peking University in 2005 and has over 18 years of experience in the economic analysis and research projects both in China and Bulgaria. In 2017 she becomes PhD in Economics and Management of Public Services from the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration at Sofia University, and since then is devoted to the academic research. In July 2021 Dr. Peneva together with a team of recognized professors and assistants at BAS completed a project on the “Trade and investment relationship of Bulgaria and China”.



SUN Churen, Professor and Doctoral Supervisor at the Guangdong Institute for International Strategies (GIIS); “Yunshan Outstanding Scholar” at Guangdong University of Foreign Studies (GDUFS); Deputy Secretary-General of Secretariat, GIIS; Deputy Dean of School of Economics and Trade, and Director of Centre for European Studies, GDUFS. He was selected as Distinguished Professor of Zhujiang Scholars of Guangdong Province (in October 2019) and Innovative Leading Talents of "Double Thousand Plan" of Jiangxi Province (short-term project, selected in March 2020). He is mainly engaged in teaching and research in the fields of international trade theories and policies, economic geography and geopolitics and economics. He has published more than 80 papers in influential journals at home and abroad, including *Economic Research Journal*, *The Journal of World Economy*, *China Industrial Economics*, *The Journal of Quantitative Economic and Technical Economics*, *Finance and Trade Economics*, and *China and World Economy*.



LIN Wenshuang is professor, Vice Dean of School of European Languages and Cultures, Vice Director of Centre for Central and Eastern European Studies, and Director of the Centre for Bulgarian Studies, Beijing Foreign Studies University. She academically focuses on Bulgarian literature, Sino-Bulgarian literary exchange and Balkan ethnic studies. In 2013, she was awarded the Bulgarian Parliamentary Medal by the Speaker of the Bulgarian Parliament.



Angel Orbetsov is Ambassador-at-large at the Bulgarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs with a diplomatic career spanning nearly 35 years. He is a graduate of MGIMO University in Moscow. He served as Director of the MFA's Asia, Australia and Oceania Directorate in 2008-2019. His postings abroad include Bulgarian embassies in Kabul, Tehran and Islamabad. In 2003-2008 he was Ambassador to China accredited also to the DPRK. He has been a lecturer at the Sofia University and the Free Universities of Varna and Burgas. He is the author of a Persian language textbook for university students and he edited the Bulgarian translations of two monographs.

1. All teachers and students are expected to implement the lecturing arrangements and requirements, including attending classes at the designated places (or online platforms) on time and observe rules for international communication during the Summer School. .
2. Students attending the summer school are expected to implement epidemic prevention and control requirements, such as wearing masks all the time, ventilating frequently, maintaining a safe social distance and taking personal protection.
3. Free textbooks, handouts and other learning materials are provided for all students during the study period, with full English lectures, seminars and exchanges.
4. Students from GDUFS and SU will work together in project teams, carrying out project research, article writing and group presentation guided by supervisors from both sides.
5. The best performing participants will be will be rewarded according to their performances of learning, attendance and group presentations. Those who pass the assessment will be awarded a certificate of completion of the Summer School jointly issued by Guangdong University of Foreign Studies and Sofia University and a certificate of attendance of five professional lectures (for GDUFS students) or course credits (for SU students). Best-performing students will also receive a letter of recommendation from professors of Guangdong University of Foreign Studies or Sofia University.
6. After revision and deliberation, the works completed by the 6 groups will be recommended for publication in *International Observation*, the internal journal of Guangdong Institute for International Strategies, GDUFS.

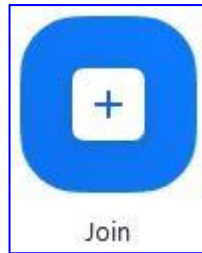

There are many ways to join a meeting, but the easiest way is to click the join link that the meeting host provided. You can also click **Join** in your Zoom client and enter the meeting ID. You may also be prompted for a meeting passcode, so keep the meeting invite information available.
